Reading Comprehension Questions

General Questions

- 1. The series focuses on two young people's mystery solving skills. What are their names and how are they related?
- 2. Ashley and Bryce struggle throughout the series with many challenges, both in their personal lives and because of the mysteries. Name two challenges from each category.
- 3. The twins are nervous around their stepdad, Sam, after learning one big secret at the end of book 1. What is this secret?
- 4. Each character deals with their problems and stress in a different way. What does Ashley do when she is searching for answers and trying to clear her head?
- 5. Who is telling the story? In what point of view?
- 6. While Ashley and Bryce are very close, they each have a very good friend whom they spend time with. Who is Ashley's good friend? Who is Bryce's?
- 7. Ashley and Bryce often rely on God's guidance. Because of their strong beliefs, it is hard when people they love do not believe. Name two people in their lives who do not believe in God.
- 8. Bryce rides a two person bicycle many miles in support of cancer. Who is riding the bicycle with Bryce?
- 9. Who is Bryce and Ashley's little brother?
- 10. Who do you relate to, Ashley or Bryce? What do you like/admire about them?
